Presidents Message

Beach hunting season is upon us. I gave a short talk about it at the meeting, but, due to time constraints, I had to cut it a bit short. Here's a bit more info on how I detect beaches and what I recommend. First, choose/use the right detector for the type of beach hunting you do. In the dry sand, just about any detector will work fine. In the wet sand and water, a simultaneous multi-frequency detector (such as a XP Deus 2, Fisher CZ20/21 or 3D, Nokta Makro Legend, and most of the VLF Minelabe machines from the early Sovereign and Excalibur, to the latest Equinox and Manticore) will give you the best performance if you want discrimination. A Pulse Induction will also work great if you don't care about absolutely digging everything, iron and all.

Next, where to hunt. If you're familiar with the beach, look for changes since the last time you detected there. Sand loss, holes, troughs, shell layers, cobble, and rocks showing are good indicators of possible good areas to search. If you are new to that beach, start by searching for hot spots for targets. I like to zig zag from dry sand to water to see if there is some sort of pattern as to where the good stuff is. Then follow that down the beach with occasional side trips higher and lower on the beach to see if the hot area gets larger at some point. Dig EVERYTHING that isn't a dead iron target. I even dig a few iron targets to make sure the detector is identifying things correctly. Sometimes in black sand, target I.D.'s can be all over the place...even in the low iron range. I don't overlap my swings unless I hit a target rich spot. I'll grid and overlap those areas. A good quality scoop is a must in the wet and water. Cheap scoops will break in no time. Even top quality scoops will break eventually, but they're worth the extra cost IMO. Wear proper footwear, hat, clothing, sunscreen, pouch, water, etc for day hunting, and a headlamp at night. Don't use waders in the ocean! They can be very dangerous if they fill with water. Use a wetsuit instead if needed. In the water, keep an eye out for critters that might bite or sting, and shuffle your feet to keep stingrays away. The depositors are doing their part, now it's time for you to do the same!

Monthly Find Competition Rules Entering Your Find

General info: We currently have 8 categories. Your find should fit into one of them!

Every find must have been made with a metal detector since the last meeting.

(Note: If your find is sent to you from another country [i.e. England] you may enter it in the month you received it) You may enter only one item in each category. items that are found together count as one item. (A cross on a chain, matching bracelets, are examples.) The competition table judges will help you place your find if needed. Their decisions are final! . Categories:

Most Unusual. Our catchall category! If your item fits better elsewhere it should be placed there. Tell us what you know about your find. Age, type of metal, what makes it unusual! Examples: a brass boat rudder, a meteorite, a toy, who knows!

Relic. Must be at least 50 years old! Describe the item.

Best Foreign Coin or Token. What is it? Is it dated? Does it have value? Type of metal? An undated gold Roman coin can go here!

Oldest Dated Coin. The date must be visible with a loop. We have to be able to read the date!

Best North American Coin. Canada, USA, and Mexican coins. An identifiable "slick" large cent might win this category.

Best Other Jewelry. Non-precious metal items that were made as personal adornment items or for display purposes.

Silver. Items stamped .800 and above or sterling. You can also have an item tested and certified. <u>Silver plated</u> items belong in Other Jewelry.

Gold, Platinum and Palladium. Items stamped with a claim as to the metal content, or tested and certified. Counterfeit items will be removed by the judges. <u>Gold plated non-precious metal</u> items belong in the Other Jewelry category.

Best overall. What was your favorite item from all of the other categories? It may be the most valuable find, or it may not! Examples: The gold ring with diamonds, the Civil War sword
