It looks like we may have a few more detector choices here soon. We've already had the Minelab Equinox 700/900 and Manticore within the last year or two. There are rumors of another new Minelab, but, nothing concrete yet. Nokta has had the Legend for a while now, and there are some even more affordable machines called FindX and Score on their inventory list for the budget minded. They've also just announced two new PI machines. One for relics and one for gold. No model names yet. Garrett still has rumors of a machine called the Storm, but, there again, nothing concrete about features or purpose. Quest is a fairly new detector company and also has a few interesting machines. I haven't received any feedback on how they perform though. One interesting pin pointer they have is the Xpointer Pro which has discrimination, ground balance, an LCD display, and a Magic Holster that turns the pin pointer on and off as you remove and replace the pin pointer. Reminds me of my old Tiny Tec that I got in the early '90's as my first pin pointer. I expect XP to come out with something soon, but, not even a hint of one at the moment that I've heard. With Fisher, nothing but crickets and a rehash of their old tech. Even the Impulse AQ has totally stalled. They initially put 100 limited units up for grabs and haven't even sold those after 3+ years of trying. Still, with the companies that are still left after Tesoro and White's folded, new and exciting equipment for our hobby is still coming to a website near everyone!

Hey I'm going to OB this afternoon, does anyone want to join up?

Example 2. Let's say you are out hunting and someone walks up to you to help look for a lost item. Let's say you don't want to look for it, or you've given up looking or would like to get some additional help. Send a message to the group. Hey, I'm on Rocky's favorite beach, IB... Someone lost their keys and they are offering a reward. Is anyone available to help?

Monthly Find Competition Rules For Entering Your Find

General info: We currently have 9 categories. Your find should fit into one of them! Every find must have been made with a metal detector since the last meeting. (Note: If your find is sent to you from another country [i.e. England] you may enter it in the month you received it) You may enter only one item in each category. A picture of the item will be accepted if the item is not available to be at the meeting. Items that are found together count as one item. (A cross on a chain, matching bracelets, are examples.) The competition table judges will help you place your find if needed. Their decisions are final! .

Most Unusual. Our catchall category! If your item fits better elsewhere it should be placed there. Tell us what you know about your find. Age, type of metal, what makes it unusual! Examples: a brass boat rudder, a meteorite, a toy, who knows!

Relic. Must be at least 50 years old! Describe the item.

Best Foreign Coin . What is it? Is it dated? Does it have value? Type of metal? An undated gold Roman coin can go here!

Best Token. What is it? Is it dated? Does it have value? Type of metal?

Oldest Dated Coin. The date must be visible with a loop. We have to be able to read the date!

Best North American Coin. Canada, USA, and Mexican coins. An identifiable "slick" large cent might win this category.

Best Other Jewelry. Non-precious metal items that were made as personal adornment items or for display purposes.

Silver. Items stamped .800 and above or sterling. You can also have an item tested and certified. Silver plated items belong in Other Jewelry.

Gold, Platinum and Palladium. Items stamped with a claim as to the metal content, or tested and certified. Counterfeit items will be removed by the judges. Gold plated non-precious metal items belong in the Other Jewelry category.

Best overall. What was your favorite item from all of the other categories? It may be the most valuable find, or it may not! Examples: The gold ring with diamonds, the Civil War sword....

VOTING. Vote for one item in each category by circling the letter on the voting slip that corresponds with that item's envelope. **Vote once for your personal choice as to the best overall find from among the 9 preceding categories.**

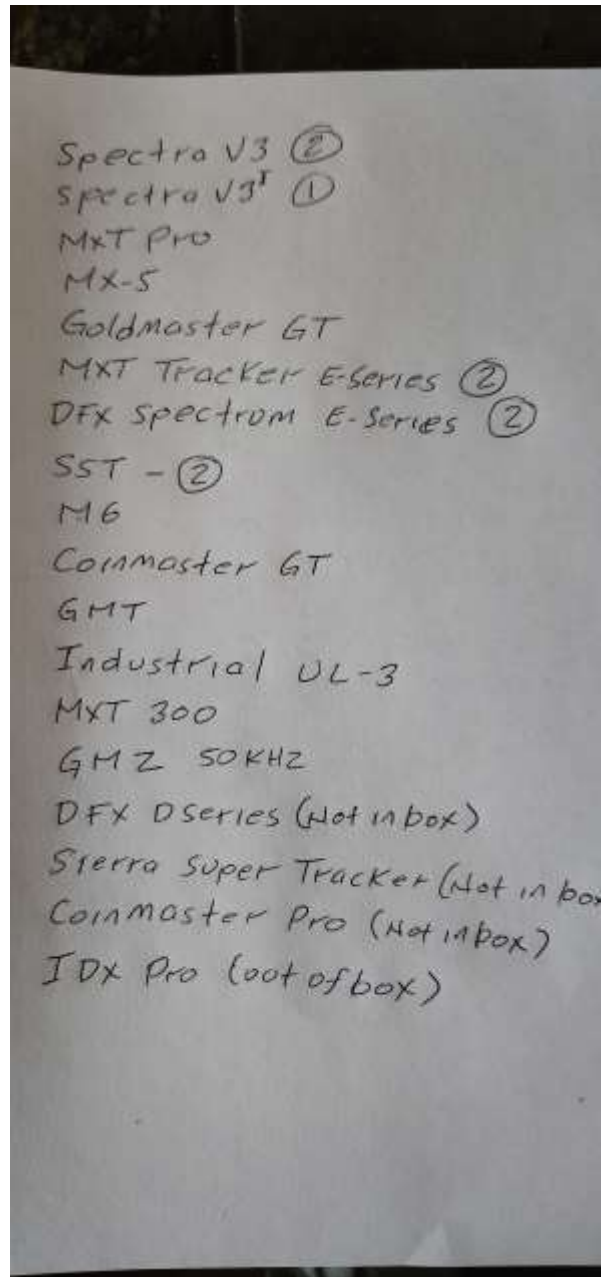
