## Presidents Message

I can't remember if I've talked about cleaning and sorting your finds or not, so, you'll just have to suffer with a repeat if I already did it. As detectorists, we find all sorts of metal, both good and junk. I like to sort the scrap metal into separate 5 gallon buckets. Well, maybe the lead in a smaller container so I can still lift it! I also have one for brass, one for copper, and currently one for aluminum, although I'm not sure it's worth the effort. The clad I find goes into a rock tumbler if it's too crusty to go through the CoinStar machine. Your bank may require coins to be fairly clean too if you decide to roll them instead. I like the CoinStar because it's easy, no stuffing coins into rolls. If you want cash, they take a good 10% though. I just get the gift certificates available for all sorts of businesses. They give those for full value and there are several that I like, from Amazon to Home Depot, to Applebee's and more.

With collectible coins, you have to be a bit careful in your cleaning process. Sometimes it's best to just leave them alone. Get an opinion from an expert in coins if you have a question about that. First try to get a date and mint mark to look up to see if it's rare and has collector value. Common coins I soak with some cheap white vinegar in the bottom of an inverted aluminum can. After soaking for several hours or overnight, I rub them with baking soda and then rinse in tap water. Keep in mind that it will take tarnish and patina off the coin, along with some detail, which might not be appealing to you. Try it on something you don't care about first to see if you like the results or not. You may have to repeat the process on particularly crusty coins. I pretty much do the same with jewelry as most people want them nice, clean, and new looking. Minor tarnish on jewelry, I just use a dip, such as E-zest, but, but there are many others out there that are similar. Read the label as some chemicals are hard on certain metals and/or stones. Iron that I want to clean also get either a vinegar bath or Evaporust. Sometimes electrolysis works good too. Those can be simple to set up with an old phone charger or similar power converter. Just ask if you have a question about those. Gold Luck out there!

Dave Vilett coordinated the Silver coin Raffles.

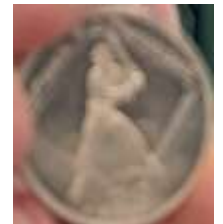
No Door prize drawing this month, Rocky is in Hawaii.

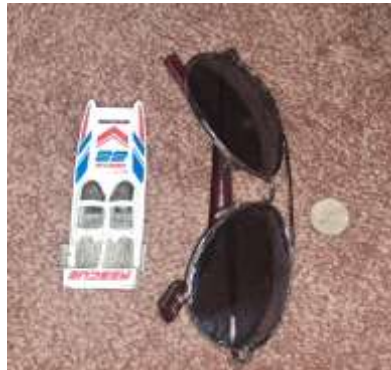

## Monthly Find Competition Rules For Entering Your Find

**General info: We currently have 9 categories. Your find should fit into one of them! Every find must have been made with a metal detector since the last meeting.** (Note: If your find is sent to you from another country [i.e. England] you may enter it in the month you received it) You may enter only one item in each category. A picture of the item will be accepted if the item is not available to be at the meeting. Items that are found together count as one item. (A cross on a chain, matching bracelets, are examples.) The competition table judges will help you place your find if needed. Their decisions are final! .

**Most Unusual.** Our catchall category! If your item fits better elsewhere it should be placed there. Tell us what you know about your find. Age, type of metal, what makes it unusual! Examples: a brass boat rudder, a meteorite, a toy, who knows!

**Relic.** Must be at least 50 years old! Describe the item.

**Best Foreign Coin .** What is it? Is it dated? Does it have value? Type of metal? An undated gold Roman coin can go here!

**Best Token.** What is it? Is it dated? Does it have value? Type of metal?

**Oldest Dated Coin.** The date must be visible with a loop. We have to be able to read the date!

**Best North American Coin.** Canada, USA, and Mexican coins. An identifiable "slick" large cent might win this category.

**Best Other Jewelry.** Non-precious metal items that were made as personal adornment items or for display purposes.

**Silver.** Items stamped .800 and above or sterling. You can also have an item tested and certified. Silver plated items belong in Other Jewelry.

**Gold, Platinum and Palladium.** Items stamped with a claim as to the metal content, or tested and certified. Counterfeit items will be removed by the judges. Gold plated non-precious metal items belong in the Other Jewelry category.

**Best overall.** What was your favorite item from all of the other categories? It may be the most valuable find, or it may not! Examples: The gold ring with diamonds, the Civil War sword....

**VOTING.** Vote for one item in each category by circling the letter on the voting slip that corresponds with that item's envelope. **Vote once for your personal choice as to the best overall find from among the 9 preceding categories.**

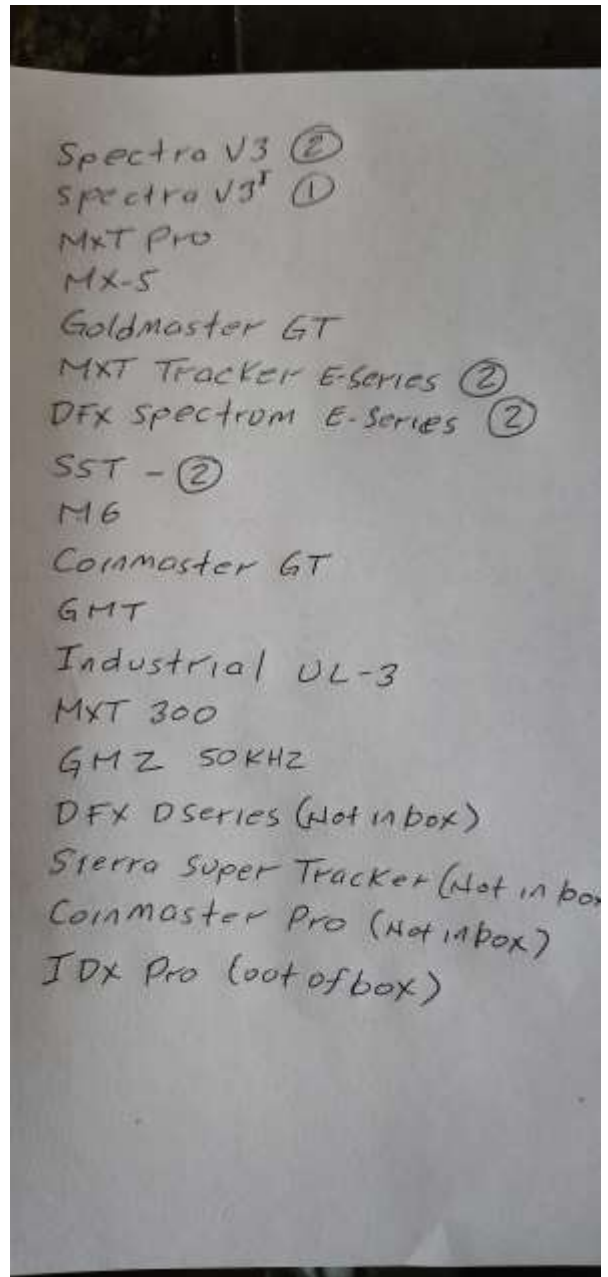
