Metal detecting has come a long way over the years, but, the desire to find treasure hasn't changed. The hobby pretty much started with old surplus mine detectors that the military used. Early pioneers like Fisher and Garrett designed their version to make it easier and cheaper to join the hobby. My first detector that I bought in 1970 was a cheap off-brand BFO (Beat Frequency Oscillator) that was a true "beep and dig" machine. Single tone, no discrimination, not ergonomically designed, and was lucky to hit a quarter under 3 inches of dry sand. That said, it made me more money than what I was making at my \$1.65/hr job! Add the fact that half my finds were silver and wheat cents, and I was in heaven. Many other detectors came and went through the years, with some being just a minor improvement, but, a few others came with a "WOW" factor. The ones I remember most were the first TR (Transmit/Receive) I used (Compass, remember them?), a White's Coinmaster, the first computerized one (White's Eagle 2 SL90, which I still have), the Minelab Excalibur which made wet beach hunting fun instead of a noisy and frustrating nightmare, The Etrac, which got me into more serious land detecting, and the Equinox, which is nice and light, we speak the same language, and it easily became part of my arm. Now, I look at some of the other high tech ones out there to see if a new "WOW" machine is in my future. I tried the Fisher Impulse AQ limited and hate it, the Deus 2.....just couldn't sync with that machine for some reason, the Nokta Legend, which I just haven't tried, and the Minelab Manticore, which still intrigues me. Whether it hooks me or not is still to be determined. Whichever machine you choose, find one that not only speaks to you and performs, but, feels good your arm. This is supposed to be a fun hobby, not work, so, find one that makes you smile when it beeps.

Monthly Find Competition Rules For Entering Your Find

General info: We currently have 9 categories. Your find should fit into one of them! Every find must have been made with a metal detector since the last meeting. (Note: If your find is sent to you from another country [i.e. England] you may enter it in the month you received it) You may enter only one item in each category. A picture of the item will be accepted if the item is not available to be at the meeting. Items that are found together count as one item. (A cross on a chain, matching bracelets, are examples.) The competition table judges will help you place your find if needed. Their decisions are final! .

Most Unusual. Our catchall category! If your item fits better elsewhere it should be placed there. Tell us what you know about your find. Age, type of metal, what makes it unusual! Examples: a brass boat rudder, a meteorite, a toy, who knows!

Relic. Must be at least 50 years old! Describe the item.

Best Foreign Coin . What is it? Is it dated? Does it have value? Type of metal? An undated gold Roman coin can go here!

Best Token. What is it? Is it dated? Does it have value? Type of metal?

Oldest Dated Coin. The date must be visible with a loop. We have to be able to read the date!

Best North American Coin. Canada, USA, and Mexican coins. An identifiable "slick" large cent might win this category.

Best Other Jewelry. Non-precious metal items that were made as personal adornment items or for display purposes.

Silver. Items stamped .800 and above or sterling. You can also have an item tested and certified. Silver plated items belong in Other Jewelry.

Gold, Platinum and Palladium. Items stamped with a claim as to the metal content, or tested and certified. Counterfeit items will be removed by the judges. Gold plated non-precious metal items belong in the Other Jewelry category.

Best overall. What was your favorite item from all of the other categories? It may be the most valuable find, or it may not! Examples: The gold ring with diamonds, the Civil War sword....

VOTING. Vote for one item in each category by circling the letter on the voting slip that corresponds with that item's envelope. **Vote once for your personal choice as to the best overall find from among the 9 preceding categories.**

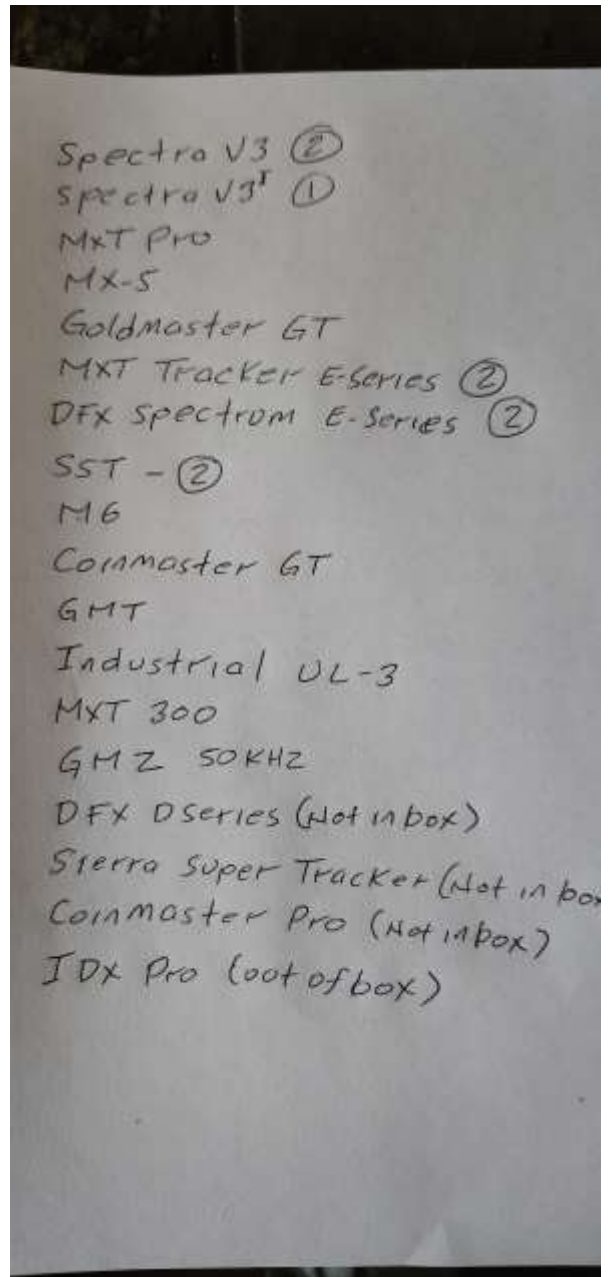

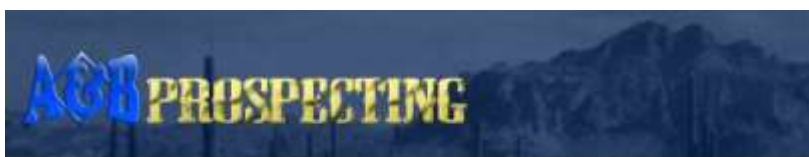
