How many of us throw out valuable finds? None of us would do that intentionally, but through ignorance, carelessness, or, just being in too big a hurry cleaning out our finds pouch, it can happen more often than you think. Even items that we "think" are junk can sometimes fool us unless we look a bit closer. When it comes to coins, a simple mint mark can make hundreds, if not thousands, of dollar difference in value. Look at the value of a 1916P mercury dime vs a 1916D. Mint errors can have the same added value. I heard recently of a guy who found a 1955 wheat cent. No big deal right? Well, after cleaning the dirt off of it, he discovered that it was the doubled die variety mint error worth hundreds. Relics are another area where being able to recognize value vs junk is key. I once found a mangled item caked in dirt that just looked like a crusty sardine can. I almost just tossed it, but, after a minor rinse, I saw hallmarks stamped into it. Well, it turns out it was a nice big chunk of sterling silver worth about \$50 in today's Ignoring good sounding targets are another form of "throwing out valuable finds". If world. you don't dig it, you could be walking away from a valuable "treasure". A few years ago, I was detecting Ocean Beach. I had been detecting all afternoon, it was getting dark, I didn't have my headlamp for night hunting, I was tired and had not found much more than junk. I was calling it quits and was heading back to my truck. I usually swing the detector as I leave and got another big booming signal in the ankle deep water that I thought was going to be just another of the dozen cans I had been finding. I almost just ignored it, but, thought, ok, I'll get rid of yet another can from the environment so it doesn't end up in a dozen pieces that I would dig at a later date. After digging down over a foot, I pulled up a wristwatch, and not just any wristwatch. After getting home, rinsing it off, and doing some research, it turned out to be a genuine Rolex....still in excellent working condition! On one trip to England, I found another button that was just one more in the dozens and dozens that I had found that week. Turns out it was silver, has the image of King Charles 1st, and one that even their museums had never seen. They deemed it treasure and is now in one of their museums. I got a nice certificate of appreciation for donating it. So, take a second look at the things you find, so, you don't accidentally toss something valuable. Thanks, Mark Rubey

Monthly Find Competition Rules For Entering Your Find

General info: We currently have 9 categories. Your find should fit into one of them! Every find must have been made with a metal detector since the last meeting. (Note: If your find is sent to you from another country [i.e. England] you may enter it in the month you received it) You may enter only one item in each category. A picture of the item will be accepted if the item is not available to be at the meeting. Items that are found together count as one item. (A cross on a chain, matching bracelets, are examples.) The competition table judges will help you place your find if needed. Their decisions are final! .

Most Unusual. Our catchall category! If your item fits better elsewhere it should be placed there. Tell us what you know about your find. Age, type of metal, what makes it unusual! Examples: a brass boat rudder, a meteorite, a toy, who knows!

Relic. Must be at least 50 years old! Describe the item.

Best Foreign Coin . What is it? Is it dated? Does it have value? Type of metal? An undated gold Roman coin can go here!

Best Token. What is it? Is it dated? Does it have value? Type of metal?

Oldest Dated Coin. The date must be visible with a loop. We have to be able to read the date!

Best North American Coin. Canada, USA, and Mexican coins. An identifiable "slick" large cent might win this category.

Best Other Jewelry. Non-precious metal items that were made as personal adornment items or for display purposes.

Silver. Items stamped .800 and above or sterling. You can also have an item tested and certified. <u>Silver plated</u> items belong in Other Jewelry.

Gold, Platinum and Palladium. Items stamped with a claim as to the metal content, or tested and certified. Counterfeit items will be removed by the judges. <u>Gold plated non-precious metal</u> items belong in the Other Jewelry category.

Best overall. What was your favorite item from all of the other categories? It may be the most valuable find, or it may not! Examples: The gold ring with diamonds, the Civil War sword....

<u>VOTING.</u> Vote for one item in each category by circling the letter on the voting slip that corresponds with that item's envelope. **Vote once for your personal choice as to the best overall find from among the 9 preceding categories.**



- 2. While Searching, leave all land and vegetation as it was by taking the necessary time to properly fill holes.
- 3. Remove litter or unwanted items from your search area, leaving it cleaner than you found it.
- 4. Limit your digging tools to a probe, a knife or small serrated trowel when searching parks, schools, or public property. Do not bring or use a shovel in a park.
- 5. When digging the beach, fill any holes which might endanger joggers or others.
- 6. As an ambassador for the Coinshooters, use thoughtfulness, consideration and courtesy at all times.
