Monthly Find Competition Rules Entering Your Find

General info: We currently have 8 categories. Your find should fit into one of them! Every find must have been made with a metal detector since the last meeting. A picture of the item will be accepted if the item is not available to be there. You may enter only one item in each category. items that are found together count as one item. (A cross on a chain, matching bracelets, are examples.) The competition table judges will help you place your find if needed. Their decisions are final! . Categories:

Most Unusual. Our catchall category! If your item fits better elsewhere it should be placed there. Tell us what you know about your find. Age, type of metal, what makes it unusual! Examples: a brass boat rudder, a meteorite, a toy, who knows!

Relic. Must be at least 50 years old! Describe the item.

Best Foreign Coin . What is it? Is it dated? Does it have value? Type of metal? An undated gold Roman coin can go here!

Best Token. What is it? Is it dated? Does it have value? Type of metal?

Oldest Dated Coin. The date must be visible with a loop. We have to be able to read the date!

Best North American Coin. Canada, USA, and Mexican coins. An identifiable "slick" large cent might win this category.

Best Other Jewelry. Non-precious metal items that were made as personal adornment items or for display purposes.

Silver. Items stamped .800 and above or sterling. You can also have an item tested and certified. <u>Silver plated</u> items belong in Other Jewelry.

Gold, Platinum and Palladium. Items stamped with a claim as to the metal content, or tested and certified. Counterfeit items will be removed by the judges. <u>Gold plated non-precious metal</u> items belong in the Other Jewelry category.

Best overall. What was your favorite item from all of the other categories? It may be the most valuable find, or it may not! Examples: The gold ring with diamonds, the Civil War sword

<u>VOTING.</u> Vote for one item in each category by circling the letter on the voting slip that corresponds with that item's envelope. **Vote once for your personal choice as to the best overall find from among the 8 preceding categories.**



Item 1: Motion to make new business cards.

Motion carried to get minimum order. It was discussed about having information put on the back of the cards. Gene Henderson will get quote.

As of 01/16/25, Gene wrote:

At the last get together we discussed what our Club's business cards should look like and information that the club wants on the back of the card to let people know what our club is all about when passing our cards out to potential people with interest.

The front I assume will look the same as what we currently have: Our name, logo, telephone contact (presidents) and a place to put the members name and or their telephone number. Or your ideas on the front as well.

Item 3: Motion to have a large seeded hunt combined/coordinated with the possibility of 5 other metal detecting clubs In so ca.

- 1 West coast prospectors and treasure hunting association. Garden Grove 2 Route 66
- 3 -Hemet Valley Jerry Kaplan(Pres), Ken Maltby(fb)
- 4-Treasure Seekers of San Diego TSSD
- 5 riversidetreasurehuntersclub.org

Jeff proposed item 3 with each club to equally put forth the cost. This is a logistics challenge. Jeff will put together a proposal and contact the Clubs and get a feel for their participation.

Item 4: Motion to have public raffles:

Last year the gold raffle was restricted to only club members.

In order to increase revenue lets have some raffles open to the public and shared with other clubs such as Illinois.

Gold coin raffle. Raise \$100 then start new raffle. Don't wait for Christmas party and open to public.

The board agreed to try this approach in February and March to see if it works out. Logistics will need to be worked out.

Item 6: Motion to not charge for membership in 2025

This motion was voted down.

Item 7: If we charge for membership, then change the pro-rated amount to \$10 individual for July – Dec instead of the current monthly prorated amount.

A change has been proposed for membership dues.

New members will pay the following: January to June will be \$20 for single membership and \$30 for family membership. July to December will be prorated at \$10 single membership and \$15 for family membership.

Current members renewing will stay \$20 for single membership and \$30 for family membership throughout the year. There will not be any proration.

This is a By-Law change and will have to be voted in by the membership at the February Meeting.

This is what is in the Clubs By-Laws as of 1/17/25:

Article IV MEMBERSHIP DUES

The amount of Club Membership shall be:

Single Membership - \$20.00 a year, renewable annually at January meeting, Prorated at \$1.66 per month to the March meeting.

Family Membership - \$30.00 a year, renewable annually at January meeting. Prorated \$2.50 per month to the March meeting.

Dues shall fall due and payable on or before the January meeting of each year.

If a paid-up member decides to drop out, there will be no refund of dues under any circumstance.

Any member in arrears by the March meeting will be dropped from the Club roster.

Item 8: Motion to have a Memorial Hunt for Mike Bryant

Motion carried. This will be determined later.

Item 9: Motion to not reimburse members for bringing refreshments to the meeting. Help save club expenses.

The motion carried and refreshments will be voluntary. This will be added to the standing rules.

Mark Rubey:

A proposal at the board meeting was made regarding entering finds for the competition table. Mark posed the idea that people shouldn't be penalized from entering a find just because they couldn't make a meeting. Mark's proposal is to just change "the" to "your" to the line about entering finds from the last meeting... making it "your last meeting" instead of "the last meeting". Everything else there can stay the same. This would help those who are out of town, sick, or have any other last minute situation from having their finds voided from competition just because they couldn't make the meeting that month.
