














Long time Club member is remembered



Russell W Gish

9/22/1935 – 12/26/2015

Russ's first interest with metal detecting began in 1972 with the purchase of a Heath kit metal detector GD-48 that he ordered and had to assemble in the garage. First, he tried hunting at local schools and parks but soon found out that the machine had many limitations.

Russ looked for and found a better detector and while shopping for it, found a club in San Diego: The Gem and Treasure Hunting Association. The club's purpose was searching for relics from San Diego's past, not coin shooting.

In 1974, seven families from the Gem and Treasure Hunting Association split from that club and started the Coinshooters Clique of San Diego. The new club's focus was on coin shooting and beach hunting. Russ Gish was the first president of that new club and for many years to follow as the club became known as the Coinshooters of San Diego.

Realizing that equipment for the hobby was not readily available, Russ started innovating sand scoops, electronic probes and electrolysis cleaners. He sold these items locally and by mail order nation wide and internationally.

In the late 1970's Russ and a partner opened "House of Treasure Hunters". The shop sold metal detectors, treasure hunting equipment and prospecting supplies in the mid 1980's. Russ sold his portion of the business to his partner and went to work at San Diego Coin Exchange.

Eventually, he got busy with life and a new marriage so he stepped away from the club. Many years later after retirement in his 50s he renewed his interest in metal-detecting. Russ rejoined the San Diego Coinshooters, he authored three books about metal-detecting and became the president of the club again until down shortly before his passing on December 26, 2015 at the age of eighty.

The club was a driving force in his life. He spent many hours thinking and planning for the Club's success.

He was laid to rest at Miramar National Cemetery. The epitaph on his grave marker reads: Low tide -Gone Metal

Monthly Find Competition Rules for Entering Your Find

General info: We currently have 9 categories. Your find should fit into one of them! Every find must have been made with a metal detector since the last meeting and in the United States and United States Territories. You may enter only one item in each category. A picture of the item will be accepted if the item is not available to be at the meeting. Items that are found together count as one item. (A cross on a chain, matching bracelets, are examples.)

The competition table judges will help you place your find if needed. Their decisions are final!

Categories:

Most Unusual. Our catchall category! If your item fits better elsewhere it should be placed there. Tell us what you know about your find. Age, type of metal, what makes it unusual! Examples: a brass boat rudder, a meteorite, a toy, who knows!

Relic. Must be at least 50 years old! Describe the item.

Best Foreign Coin . What is it? Is it dated? Does it have value? Type of metal? An undated gold Roman coin can go here!

Best Token. What is it? Is it dated? Does it have value? Type of metal?

Oldest Dated Coin. The date must be visible with a loop. We have to be able to read the date!

Best North American Coin. Canada, USA, and Mexican coins. An identifiable "slick" large cent might win this category.

Best Other Jewelry. Non-precious metal items that were made as personal adornment items or for display purposes.

Silver. Items stamped .800 and above or sterling. You can also have an item tested and certified. <u>Silver plated</u> items belong in Other Jewelry.

Gold, Platinum and Palladium. Items stamped with a claim as to the metal content, or tested and certified. Counterfeit items will be removed by the judges. <u>Gold plated non-precious metal</u> items belong in the Other Jewelry category.

Best overall. What was your favorite item from all of the other categories? It may be the most valuable find, or it may not! Examples: The gold ring with diamonds, the Civil War sword

<u>VOTING.</u> Vote for one item in each category by circling the letter on the voting slip that corresponds with that item's envelope. **Vote once for your personal choice as to the best overall find from among the 8 preceding categories.**




